The Franklin Simpson Educational Excellence Foundation Scholarship is made available through the Franklin Simpson Educational Excellence Foundation. The Foundation is a community-based, non-profit organization that encourages innovative teaching and learning strategies in the Franklin-Simpson School System and community.

Purpose:

This scholarship is designed to recognize one or more graduating Franklin-Simpson seniors planning to attend a university/college <u>majoring in an education-related field (i.e. teacher education, counseling, psychology, sociology, social work, speech pathology, etc.)</u> and exemplifying excellence throughout his/her high school experience.

Administration:

The Franklin Simpson Educational Excellence Foundation board of directors will administer the scholarship with additional input from the Franklin-Simpson High School administration. The scholarship amount for 2026 shall be \$2,000 for the first semester with an additional \$2,000 for the second semester pending documentation of a 3.0 college grade point average for the first semester. This is a one-year only scholarship

Eligibility:

- Demonstrated scholastic ability with a minimum 3.0 unweighted grade point average & TWO letters of recommendation <u>related to student's suitability for education major/career.</u>
 Attach the high school transcript.
- 2. Extracurricular involvement including leadership positions held. May include work and volunteer experience.
- 3. Demonstrated commitment to academic excellence by attendance record of at least 90% during first two grading periods of senior year. Attendance for the entire year must equal 90% to receive the award.
- 4. Financial need.

Selection:

- 1. Students will apply for the scholarship through the guidance counselor's office.
- 2. Students will complete the scholarship application and return it with **2 letters of recommendation** and a transcript to the guidance office by the application deadline of noon, April 16th.
- 3. The committee will review and discuss all applications. The scholarship committee may request interviews with finalists.
- 4. The committee will select one or more scholarship recipient(s). Multiple scholarships in varying amounts may be awarded depending on number of applicants and strength of applications.
- 5. A member or designee of the Franklin Simpson Educational Excellence Foundation board of directors or its designee will present the recipient with plaque and documentation indicating award of the scholarship at the Senior Awards Night.
